Clustered field sedge (*Carex praegracilis*)

Running a lawnmower for an hour releases the same amount of pollution as driving your car 350 miles.

**For a softer, natural look mow only once a year.
Mix in native perennials and wildflowers for a
colorful and low maintenance meadow!**

**For a more traditional, formal lawn,
mow only once every 10 to 14 days.
Depending on the climate, soil and season
water only every couple of weeks—or less!**
